"Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" - Galatians 6:2.

ONE of the most prevalent spiritual ailments is self-pity. It begins with the turning of the mind in on itself in morbid reflection. It ends in the conviction that God or fate or luck has singled us out as a striking case of misfortune and injustice. We feel aggrieved and resentful as we plod wearily and gloomily along the road that leads to despair. Paul has given us a hint of a cure, when he says, "Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." What we really crave is a lot of very soft and sentimental sympathy from those who will weep over us and weep with us. What we need is to turn our eyes outward toward other people. We are not pleased, but we are shocked and rebuked to discover that there are always sadder cases than our own; that there are so many people who need our help when we thought that we needed theirs. We begin by adding their burdens to ours and cutting the sum in two. We find rich fellowship and deep joy in suffering for and with others. We learn to like people we never liked before because we are kind to them. We feel ashamed to tell of our own miseries. Our burdens grow strangely light and unimportant. "SOWING TO THE WIND"

There has been a prolific amount of philosophical "sowing to the wind" in recent years about marriage and now we watch as our culture "reaps the whirlwind" of distorted thinking and behavior (Hosea 8:7). Society has undergone a dangerous disconnect with common sense and Biblical teaching about gender differences and the unique roles and responsibilities of men and women, especially in marriage and parenting and the church. Powerful personalities and politicians in our land, including the current President of the United States, are now unwilling to define marriage the way the Bible does — as a God designed relationship between a man and a woman, ideally to last a life time (Genesis 2:18, Matthew 19). God's plan for marriage and the home and the church requires two complimentary, but distinctive components — males and females — and no amount of trying to redesign marriage to the contrary by a high and mighty judge or court, a church council, a president, popular practice, or pop culture personalities can change that fundamental fact.
