## “The Other One”

I think most of us credit ourselves with being longsuffering, forgiving and patient (even if we don't deserve such credit). There is no getting around the fact that in this life, we are going to get on each other's nerves; we are going to irritate one another; we are going to face contention, and sometimes outright offense. It is at these times that we all try to exercise patience, with varying degrees of success. If we somehow manage to not blow our tops and yell and scream, we credit ourselves with righteousness. If we can avoid plotting the downfall and ultimate demise of the offending party, we pat ourselves on the back and say we “turned the other cheek”, don't we? But is that enough? Is it enough to merely refrain from violent outburst and mean-spirited thoughts and behavior? Jesus had a few words to say about this subject: “*You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, Do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also; and if anyone wants to sue you and take your coat, give your cloak as well; and if anyone forces you to go one mile, go also the second mile*” (Mt. 5:38-42). Do we return a harsh word with a kind one? Do we seek to help those who have hurt us? It seems counter-intuitive, doesn't it? It goes against our selfish nature to put ourselves in harm's way; especially after we have just experienced a hurt. But there is a reason we are commanded to do this, and we trust the divine wisdom behind this practice of returning evil with good: “*If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head with*” (Romans 12:20-21) SELECTED

**SING TO ME OF HEAVEN**

We sing a number of songs in worship which have to do with that ultimate promise of God to faithful Christians – Heaven. From the picture we receive from the Holy Scriptures, we know that these songs are not exaggerated in the least. They are not songs to just “pump us up” in a desperate search for “something” beyond this life – not just an empty, impossible longing for a place of rest from this world’s strife and struggle – not a fairy tale for those bowed down in pain who seek relief – not just an empty hope for the elderly nearing the end of their lives. Instead, they are an assurance, an encouragement to us not to give up the fight, and yield to the devil (where there is no hope). By faith, we know Heaven is real, rather than a mere figment of imagination – and we know this, because of the source of our faith, the Word of God. Romans 10:17 says, “So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.” Consequently, if the Scriptures tell us there is such a place, by faith we know that there is. Do we believe Jesus spoke the Truth? Listen to His words of John 14:1-4 “Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father’s house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. And where I go you know, and the way you know.” ? Do we believe the Father? Paul says in Titus 1:2-3, “in hope of eternal life which God, who cannot lie, promised before time began, but has in due time manifested His word through preaching, which was committed to me according to the commandment of God our Savior; “?Do we believe the description of that resting place in Revelation 21 and 22 – that it will be a beautiful place of no more tears, pain, sorrow, tribulation, or temptation? “Let not your heart be troubled”, Jesus says – “I go to prepare a place for you.”
