"REARING CHILDREN"

Since the creation of man, children have been part of God's plan. God's first command to Adam and Eve concerned procreation. He said, "Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, (Gen. 1:28). After the flood, God told Noah and his sons, "Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth. . . . And you, be ye fruitful, and multiply; bring forth abundantly in the earth, and multiply therein" (Gen. 9:1, 7). Having children is part of the natural order of things, and today, most consider procreation to be a God-given right.

There is, however, a difference between having children and rearing children. Just about anyone who is of age is capable of having children. Rearing children requires extensive knowledge and a long term commitment. Many, including the married, simply do not take rearing children into consideration when they procreate, and this becomes a problem.

It is the rearing of children that is of utmost importance to the Lord. Malachi explains the purpose of marriage in Malachi 2:15. If a couple can produce, but not rear a child (for financial or other reasons), then, given the purpose of marriage, they should wait until they can be faithfully responsible in fulfilling that purpose. Like the infertile couple, they are not expected to do what they cannot accomplish. In today's world, however, social conditions tend toward the dissolution of the family able to bear in producing and rearing children.

Having and rearing more children should not be a hasty decision, but one that is considered carefully and prayerfully, and in the end, it is the couple's choice. Preachers and teachers who push children upon unready couples would do well to memorize and observe 1 Thessalonians 4:11a and the last eight words of 1 Peter 4:15.
