"The Importance of Brotherly Love"

Love that exists between Christian brothers and sisters is one of the clearest testimonies that we are in fellowship with God. "He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him." (1 John 2:10) "This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth: But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all sin". (1 John 1:5-7) One of the best Biblical texts dealing with the importance of brotherly love is 1 John 4:7-21. In this article we'll examine some of what this text has to teach us regarding love. Brotherly love is NOT optional. Some live in self-deception. John gives a stern warning. "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? And this commandment have we from him, that he who loveth God loves his brother also." (1 John 4:20-21) Hate is a strong word. What is hate? It is no more, nor any less than the absence of Love. For the true Christian, love is not optional. It is not something about which he can have a "take it or leave it" attitude. Let us love one another! Love is of God. He is the source, definition and supreme example of love. With brotherly love I leave "church going" behind and live as a true and authentic Christian and have bold confidence in my standing before God. Without love, my "church going" and communion observances are nothing more than a hypocritical sham. If we really love God and the Church at Crockett Road, let us activate our LOVE! DAN
