The Safest Place to Be

How to stay safe in the world today...

- 1) Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
- 2) Do not stay home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
- 3) Avoid walking on streets or sidewalks because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
- 4) Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
- 5) Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in Hospitals. So, above all else, avoid hospitals.



THE CROSS OF JESUS

The cross of Jesus is the symbol of discipleship. **Jesus's cross** is the most glorifying thing to God known to man. In (Mark 8:34) Jesus said "If any man will come after me, let him take up his cross and follow me." The death of **Jesus on the cross** was mandated by God in order that all mankind could receive forgiveness of sin.

The **Cross of Jesus** is the most awesome expression of love known to man.
