GOD AND COUNTRY

Oftentimes Christians talk like you should have no loyalty for your country, as if love for your country was always a bad thing. To be sure, this must never be ultimate loyalty. We must always obey God rather than men. But most Christians have understood the fifth commandment to be about honoring not only your parents, but all those in authority over you. Moreover, Jesus shows it's possible to honor God and honor Caesar. This is especially clear if you know some of the Jewish history. The tax in question in Mark 12 is about the poll tax or census tax. It was first instituted in 6 AD, not too many years before Jesus' ministry. When it was established, a man by the name of Judas of Galilee led a revolt. According to Josephus, "He called his fellow countrymen cowards for being willing to pay tribute to the Romans and for putting up with mortal masters in place of God." Like the Zealots, he believed allegiance to God and allegiance to any earthly government were fundamentally incompatible. As far as they were concerned, if God was your king, you couldn't have an earthly king. But Jesus completely disagreed. By telling the people to "render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's," he was saying there are duties to government that do not infringe on your ultimate duty to God. It's possible to honor lesser authorities in good conscience because they have been instituted by a greater authority. If you read all that the New Testament says about governing authorities in places like Romans 13 and 1 Peter 2, you see that we should be loyal to the country that God has blessed so much. How thankful we should be to be an American. May God help us to remain "A Nation Under God Indivisible, With Liberty And Justice For All". DAN

"SERIOUS AND SENSIBLE"

We are all commanded to be a sober saint. Titus 2:11-12 reminds us, "For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age." According to Strong's Concordance, the Greek word translated "soberly" in this passage means "with sound mind to be of sane mind-to be in right mind." The same root Greek word is found in Titus 2:6 which commands young men to be *sober -minded"; in Titus 2:5 where young women are taught to be 'discreet"; in Titus 2:2 where older men are instructed to be "temperate." The New International Version translates this term "selfcontrolled" throughout Titus 2, and the New American Standard Bible renders it "sensible." Put it all together and vou learn that God wants sober saints who live selfcontrolled, sane and sensible lives! Luke 15:17 (NIV) tells us that it was only when the prodigal son "came to his senses" that he took steps to get out of the pig-pen his sin had put him in. Have you done something spiritually insane and insensible? Are you in a pig-pen of sin? The devil wants to intoxicate and cloud your spiritual mind and judgement to the point you Will stay there, but you don't have to. In a world drunk on sin, you can sober up and come to your senses and come back to our Heavenly Father. Let the mind of the Christ master your mind and you will be a sober, sensible saint. Thank God for those who are such.

One time four-year-old Johnny got things a little mixed up, as four-year olds tend to do. After singing a Christmas carol and the song was finished, he commented: "It's great that the shepherds put on clean clothes when they went to see baby Jesus." His mother gently asked, "What do you mean, Johnny?" The little theologian looked at her and said, "You know. Didn't we just sing, 'While Shepherds Washed Their Socks by Night?' " (You'll have to ask if you don't know the song!) Johnny had the song wrong, but he had the right idea. We have to clean up if we ever expect to see Jesus or get into Heaven. Practically all evangelical churches/denominations agree that the blood of Jesus Christ is God's solitary agent to cleanse the stubborn stain sin leaves on our souls. The Hebrews writer proclaims the amazing power of the blood of Christ. He insisted that although it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins,' the cross of Christ gives Christians "boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus" (Hebrews 10:4, 19; see also verses 5 -18). It is a fundamental fact of the Gospel — our salvation from sin is Heaven sent and blood bought! One man hit the nail on the head when he wrote, "The blood of Jesus is the only detergent that can cleanse away a single sin"
