"LET'S BE DEVOTED"

The disciples we read about in Acts 2 were not halfhearted Christians who had to be begged to attend worship assemblies of the church or get involved in the work of the Lord. After a Christ-centered and fearless sermon that confronted hearers with their sin and guilt (2:14-36), there was a heaven-sent, Holy Spirit-guided answer to the question of what to do to be forgiven and saved from that sin (2:37-41). Some churches and preachers today won't raise or answer this question, and others change the inspired answer Peter and the other apostles gave. But on that day long ago about 3,000 believers repented and were baptized for forgiveness of sins under the terms of the Great Commission (Mark 16:15-16; Matthew 28:18-20). And talk about changed lives! Read Acts 2:41-47! What a church and what church members! Verse 42 says they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers." The New International Version says "they devoted themselves" to these things. These were devoted disciples! These things came first in their lives. The Greek word for "continued steadfastly" or "devoted" means "to be earnest towards a thing, to persevere, be constantly diligent; to attend assiduously all the exercises, or to adhere closely to; to give self continually upon" Christians devoted to Bible study, preaching, fellowship, and worship assemblies! Does your own approach to discipleship resemble that level of devotion? ADAPTED

ARE YOU A KIND PERSON?

'And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise. For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? for sinners also love those that love them. And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ve? for sinners also do even the same. And if ve lend (to them) of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and (to) the evil" (Luke 6:31-35). Pay attention to that last statement; "he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil." We learn something important about God here; even those who hate Him receive kind treatment at His hands. Paul refers to the salvation God offers through Jesus Christ and His gospel as "the kindness of God" in Titus 3:4. Kindness is something in which every person can improve and grow; judging from the new testament s words on the subject, God plainly intends it to be a common characteristic of His saints. Kindness does NOT "come naturally" for everyone, and it is especially hard to extend kindness to some folks. When a man knowingly lives a wicked life, Christians can be sorely challenged to show him much kindness; but such is our responsibility, Colossians 3:12. In Ephesians 4:32, Paul instructs us to "... be ye kind one to another." **DAVE ROGERS**

WHAT BUILDS A STRONG VIBRANT CHURCH?

Not sensationalism! Not gimmicks! Not just committees or mere programs with a "fun and games" emphasis! These things may be "right-on" for civic clubs, and country clubs, but not for the Lord's church! What does it take to build a strong church? I believe with all my heart that the following things are essential!

- 1. Strong Bible preaching and teaching! God's word, when it is disseminated plainly, forcefully, uncompromisingly, and yet kindly, will BUILD UP! Paul said, "I commend you unto God, and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up. ..." Acts 20:32.
- 2. Exemplary Leadership! Men who make themselves "examples to the flock," and who are careful in tending it (1 Peter 5:2-3). To grow, the church must have quality leadership men who know how to lead it and will do so.
- 3. Christian living on the part of every member! Unimpeachable conduct so clearly evidenced in the lives of Christians will illuminate the way for many in the realm of darkness (Matthew 5:16; Philippians 2:15).
- 4. Congregational warmth and love! The fellowship of the Lord's church should be so sweet and precious that the whole community takes note, and observes, "See how they love each other!" Without this, a congregation will never be what God would have it be!
- 5. **Compassionate hearts!** The church of Christ needs to be known as the most tender-hearted bunch of people in all the world . . .ready and willing to help all, and especially those of the household of faith (Galatians 6:9-10).
- 6. Evangelistic fervor! The emphasis of the early church was soulwinning! The church will grow when we cease not to *"teach and to preach Jesus as the Christ"* every day, wherever we have opportunity (Acts 5:42).
- 7. An "I want to serve" attitude permeating the congregation! People serving the Lord because they love Him. They want to serve and do not have a spirit of drudgery.
- 8. An atmosphere of happiness, friendliness, cordiality, and hospitality! No stranger should ever come into the midst of the Lord's church without being graciously greeted and welcomed by a happy, friendly membership! We must reach out to others, and not just "visit" with friends.

CAN YOU FORGIVE?

Christians are to be a part of Christ. This is the literal meaning of the word "Christian." To be like Christ is to be our lifelong aspiration. Jesus did not wait for the lame man to ask for forgiveness, He went ahead and said to him, "Son, your sins are forgiven you" (Matthew 9:2). I know that we argue that Jesus knew men's hearts and that we don't, but such should not be used as an excuse to hold a grudge and withhold forgiveness. Refusing to forgive has caused wars. Unforgiveness has driven once great friends to becoming enemies, and never speaking to one another. Unforgiveness has caused broken homes, and has caused brothers and sisters to treat each other with disrespect and loathing. Unforgiveness is, in and of itself, a sin. How many times have you heard the statement, "I just can't forgive them." I have heard it more than I would like to. I understand that full forgiveness cannot be granted until someone asks for forgiveness, but that did not stop Jesus on the cross from saying, "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). Jesus stood ready to forgive as the offense against Him was being committed. Paul is teaching the Ephesians that forgiveness is partially based on what we owe Jesus for our forgiveness. When viewed this way, what right would we have to ever withhold our forgiveness from someone? We are to forgive just as Christ has forgiven us. Matt. 6 DAN
