"Is It Just Words Of My Mouth Or Meditation Of My Heart"

One of the great blessings of God is the opportunity to glorify Him in song. Too often we sing hymns of praise but we like those on Matt. 15:8 and just words. We should all ask ourselves if we really mean what we sing. The singing of a hymn should be a great experience for Christians. A hymn can be a prayer, a testimony, praise, or an invitation to others. Many of us apparently don't take the words we sing very seriously.

- 1. We sing "Sweet Hour of Prayer" and pray only a few minutes each day.
- 2. We sing "Onward Christian Soldiers" and wait to be drafted.
- 3. We sing "Oh, for a Thousand Tongues to Sing" and don't use the ones we have to speak of Christ
- 4. We sing "Blest Be the Tie" and let the slightest offense sever it.
- 5. We sing "I Love to Tell the Story" and seldom mention Jesus to anybody.
- 6. We sing "Serve the Lord with Gladness" and gripe about all we have to do.
- 7. We sing "Cast Thy Burden on the Lord" and then worry ourselves into a nervous breakdown.
