

ARE YOU REALLY DEVOTED AND LOYAL TO GOD?

At times it is hard for many people to see how wrong it is to introduce into the work and worship of the Lord's church anything that just simply appeals to them. They do not realize that to mix human wisdom with divine is offensive to God. Jesus rebuked the most pious Jews of his day because they could not accept what God said as sufficient; they had to add their own traditions and customs and make them of equal, if nor more, important than scripture. True Christian has pledge to be devoted and to the Lord Jesus Christ. If one remains true to that pledge, customs and human traditions will not be allowed to become sacred. The ways of this world will not become a strong influence, and his/her desire will ever be to conform to the teaching of the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus said, "This people honoreth me with their lips; But their heart is far from me. But in vain do they worship me, Teaching (as their) doctrines the precepts of men" (Matt. 15:8-9). One lesson we must eventually learn is that God's ways are incomparable to man's. The ancient prophet wrote, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith Jehovah. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts" (Isa 55:8-9). The wisdom of this world is but foolishness to Almighty God. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, And the discernment of the discerning will I bring to nought. Where is the wise? where is the scribe? where is the disputer of this world? hath not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?" (1 Cor 1:19-20). James wrote of a religion that was vain (James 1:26). Jesus said those who held to the traditions of men made void the commandments of God (Mark 7:8). A religion that is vain cannot be the religion that honors God. Not to put the bridle of truth on the tongue makes vain religion and to bring into the worship and work of the church anything God does not authorize makes vain worship. We must always remain faithful and honor the authority of the Scriptures by upholding the Bible. DAN

WHAT IS YOUR POSITION?

We live in a world with a huge variety of religions and in a world that offers a huge variety of denominational churches, inquisitive minds that do actually want to know may become minds that are confused. In the hope of shedding some light, we offer a bit of information designed to let you know what we, the church of Christ at this congregation is all about. There are things we share in common with other churches, but there are also things that clearly distinguish us from any other religion on earth. One distinguishing mark is our allegiance to the Bible as the word of the Living God. First and foremost, this congregation is committed to practicing and preaching only those things we find authorized in the New Testament. We believe having authority is essential Col. 3:17; Rom. 15:18; Matt. 28:18-19. Second, our worship is, to the best of our ability, a replica of that which the New Testament teaches. As we assemble to take the Lord's Supper Acts 2:42; 20:7 we also pray together 1 Cor. 14:15-16, we give of our means to support the work of the church 1 Cor. 16:1-4, we teach the sacred word 1 Thess. 5:27 and sing praises to God Eph. 5:19. Third, our work consists of causing the gospel to be preached Phil. 1:5, relief of the needy for whom the church is responsible Acts 6:1-6; 1 Tim. 5:16, and edification Eph. 4:12,16. We reject radicalism as well as liberalism. We seek to deviate neither to the left nor to the right, "from any of the words God commands" Deut. 28:14. We endeavor to include nothing not found in the New Testament, but also to include all that is found in the New Testament as it pertains to our work and worship. If questions arise about us, please let us know. We will not be deliberately wrong on anything. DAN
