"GOD IS NOT AN IMPERSONAL IDOL"

Many of us have heard the preacher story where the wife asks her husband why he never tells her he loves her. The husband replies; "that's not true. Thirty two years ago when we got married I told you I loved you and if I ever change my mind I'll let you know!" We smile at this story because we know the underlying truth; it is more important for a husband and wife to daily show their love for each other, than it is to say "I love you" every day, and then fail to demonstrate that love via tangible actions. In a similar way, it is the consistent outward demonstration of love that makes Christianity unique among religions, and Christians unique among men. Christianity is a religion of love. God demonstrates his love daily! He revealed His love to us by assuming human form, giving himself as a sacrifice. Still, today, He reveals His love by reconciling us to Him and extending His saving grace to all who are willing to accept it! There is no other religion whose God is so willing to demonstrate his love, which He did by handing Himself, via His Son, over to His creatures as an example of that love. Jesus took it upon Himself to show us the mercy of God by taking on the punishment each of us has brought on ourselves because of the sinful lives we lead. Jesus lived as we live, walked as we walk, suffered as we suffer, and was tempted as we're tempted, yet remained sinless. Everything He taught He lived. He was and is the perfect example for us. His unselfish act is still difficult for us to comprehend, enduring insults, beatings and the rejection of friends. He poured out His life in an unmatched act of love for a world that was not worthy to behold Him. His entire life, but especially His passion and death, stand as the ultimate demonstration of love. Let us love Him in return.
