### **"THE UNCLAIMED GIFT"**

Several years ago, a story appeared in the newspapers, about a homeless man found dead on the streets of Los Angeles. His name was Morris Stegel. On the surface he seemed like your average Los Angeles street-person – roaming about in dark alleys, sleeping out-of-doors, carrying everything he owned in an old shopping cart. And he died the way you would expect a street-person to die – sprawled in an alley, dead of natural causes, heart trouble perhaps. "But there was something different about Morris Stegel. Maybe it was that he had three bank accounts, containing a total of \$207,421.00. "It seems that ten years earlier Morris' father had died and left the money to him. But Morris didn't want it. When Morris did not claim it, the Division of Unclaimed Property tracked him down, and his family tried to force him to take it. They even arranged a ceremony to turn the money over to him, but Morris did not show up for the presentation. Later, he allowed himself to take enough of the money to buy an old car; which he used to sleep in during bad weather. His relatives rented him an apartment, but he never lived in it. Finally on Dec.10, 1959, he died just as he lived, a homeless man of the streets; with three dollars in his pocket and an unclaimed fortune in the bank. "Does this story sound crazy?? Well, figure this one out. Ole' Morris lived a wasted life and died a futile death, but don't be too quick to point the finger at him. He was only dealing with temporal things, while many people play the same losing game with an eternal, priceless fortune left to them by Jesus Christ.
