AM I ONE PERSON ON SUNDAY, AND A WHOLE DIFFERENT PERSON ON MONDAY AND TUESDAY?


Hypocrisy means to live a lie; to be a human contradiction; a walking deceit. Basically, it is the perfect character trait of the devil himself. Ask yourself: how do I act on Sunday? Am I always smiling, always shaking hands, paying attention. Now compare that "you" to the "you" during the week. Is there a difference?

Consider some verses on the subject:

"Ye that love the Lord, hate evil" (Psa. 97:10). Can I love the Lord on Sunday and not love Him on Monday? Yes, by not hating evil on Monday. In Proverbs 6, we learn there are seven things God hates. One of which is "a false witness that speaketh

lies" (Pro. 6:19). Ask yourself: Is my life between services a walking lie? Or maybe:

Is my life *during* services the lie? Either way, God hates hypocrisy. A hypocritical life has nothing in common with God. It is, however, a perfect fit for Satan.

4. SAY "AMEN!"

Don't be bashful. If you believe something is well said, let the class know it.

5. TAKE NOTES!

You will encourage the teacher, set a good example, and have a record for later study.

6. STUDY AT HOME!

You will learn more and be able to contribute more to the class.

7. SHOW THE TEACHER APPRECIATION

A good word or perhaps a note will encourage him and inspire him to do even better.

8. DISAGREE SWEETLY!

Others will at least know you are listening, and your attitude will make it easier for them to see your point of view and profit from it.

9. TALK THE CLASS UP!

Show excitement and tell someone else what you have gained. They too will become excited.

10. CHANGE!

This is the most difficult part, but a class is of little value if principles are not applied to life.
