"OUR BLINDED EYES"

Spiritual blindness can be caused by a number of things. Ignorance will cause people not to see God's will. Once they hear the word of God, their eyes are open. Love of sin will cause some to be spiritually blind. They do not see the truth for the same reason a criminal does not see a police officer; he is not looking for one. We do not see the truth because we are looking at other things. As I read passages such as Matthew 15.14, I wonder if the Pharisees knew they were blind. They were the educated, the scholars of the Law of Moses. Yet they did not grasp the whole of God's word. Five times in Matthew 23 Jesus uses the word "blind" to describe the Jewish leaders. Let such be a warning to us. We may think we are seeing everything that needs to be seen, but be blind to certain things. For instance, we may be blind to opportunities to spread the Gospel of Christ. The "Great Commission" in Matthew 28:18 applies to all of us. Are we truly seeking opportunities to talk with our friends, neighbors, and family about the word of God? We may be blind to those that need our encouragement. "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works" (Hebrews 10.24). This passage is not limited to our encouragement in assembling together to worship God. We all need encouragement from time to time. We need to see those visiting with us at worship services. When was the last time you walked up to a visitor and introduced yourself to them? Another thing that causes us to be blind is being too busy. "Idleness is the devil's workshop" is an old saying. It rings true, but business can also be a tool of the devil. We may intend to visit someone in the hospital or spend time with a home bound Christian and never "get around to it." It is not indifference causing our blindness, but our hectic lifestyle. Jesus came to open the eyes of those spiritually blind. Let us see all that there needs to be seen. Having the right answers is one thing, doing the right thing is another. - SELECTED

Have you ever given much thought to why you do what you do as a Christian? Many Christians mistakenly think that the only acceptable reason to serve God is because we love Him (Matt. 22:37). While love for God is certainly a Biblical and worthwhile motive for service, it is far from being the only motive mentioned in Scripture. Consider several Biblical motives for serving God:

Expression of love — Jesus said, "If you love Me, keep My commandments" (John 14:15). Genuine Christianity is characterized by a faith that works through love (Gal. 5:6). Our desire to please God because we love Him is certainly a high and noble motive to serve Him with our whole heart (Deut. 6:4-6; cf. 1 Jn. 5:3).

Increased effectiveness for God's use — Another motive for obeying God's commands is that we desire to be used more fully in His service. Paul writes about Christians who cleanse themselves from sin in order to be, "a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work" (2 Tim. 2:21).

Fear of God — Some would undoubtedly object to this idea, but God clearly intends that we have a healthy fear of Him. The Hebrews writer warns us not to draw back from serving God, "for our God is a consuming fire" (Heb. 12:29). When Ananias and Sapphira were destroyed for lying to the apostles, "great fear came upon all the church, and upon all who heard these things" (Acts 5:5, 11).

Desire for influence on others — One great motive for serving God is the realization that our lives touch and influence others. Jesus commanded His disciples to, "let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). Peter wrote of how Christian wives could win their unbelieving husbands through their example, "without a word" (1 Pet. 3:1-2).

The appeal of its contents had caused a person to purchase it and then consume the momentary feeling of pleasure. When the can was emptied, it had no use and was carelessly thrown out for someone else to pick up. It was empty. It had no use. It had lost its appeal. It was, but for a moment. It was worthless. Man has always sought for the momentary pleasures to fill his void. Looking for the appeal of alcohol man seeks out these cans of vipers poison and drinks his fill and while finding a sense of satisfaction for the moment realizes that it is only for a moment. His life is like the can he threw away - emptied, rejected, little use, shallow and unfulfilled. Lives have been destroyed because of intoxicating drink. Families are torn apart daily by its presence in the home. Young people live with consequences of their actions through the use of alcohol for the rest of their lives. As Herman Melville wrote in "Moby Dick," it is truly a "demon." The wise man wrote in **Proverbs 23:29-35:**

"Who has woe? Who has sorrow? Who has contentions? Who has complaints? Who has wounds without cause? Who has redness of eyes? Those who linger long at the wine, those who go in search of mixed wine. Do not look on the wine when it is red, when it sparkles in the cup, when it swirls around smoothly; at the last it bites like a serpent, and stings like a viper. Your eyes see strange things, and your heart will utter perverse things. Yes, you will be like one who lies down in the midst of the sea, or like one who lies at the top of the mast, saving, 'They have struck me, but I was not hurt; they have beaten me, but I did not feel it. When shall I awake, that I may seek another drink?" People of God have been shown by the Lord that alcohol has no value in their lives and no purpose. The great tragedy of its use is the end result - like a discarded can on the side of the road.
