


Teen News

THE PURPOSE OF THE CHURCH IS TO STRENGTHEN .

Jesus said, And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren (Luke 22:31,32). 
