"Be swift to hear"

How many times did Jesus tell the people to listen? Phrases such as, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" (Matt 13:9) or "Therefore hear the parable of the sower" (Matt 13:18) were used to tell the audience to listen. Being slow to speak in the conversation will keep us from making rash statements and taking ridiculous positions on subjects. Be guicker to listen than to speak. DAN

ARE YOU BUSY?

Jesus went to the house of Mary and Martha, two sisters who lived in Bethany, both of them were busy. They were busy with different things. In the eyes of the world and even in the eyes of her sister, though, one seemed to be idle (Luke 10:38-42). Martha was " distracted with much serving" (Luke 10:40). She busied herself seeing that the needs of her guests were satisfied. She became so anxious about it that it consumed her. Her sister Mary sat at the Lord's feet not wishing to miss a single word He was saying. She busied herself listening to Him knowing that it was the most important thing she could be doing. When Martha complained to Jesus about her, He told her not to worry about so many things that, in reality, were not necessary. Rather, she should devote herself and her time, as Mary had, to "the one thing that is needed" -- hearing and obeying the word of God. Again, with what are you busy? Is it your job, a hobby, material possessions or worldly pleasures? If so, what does that say as to what you really are? What do others think is your first love? Are you busy doing the important things?
