"GENUINE REPENTANCE"

Someone once wrote, "Some often repent, yet never reform; they resemble a man traveling in a dangerous path, who frequently starts and stops, but never turns back." What is repentance? How important is it to Christians of any age? And finally, what does this have to do with walking by the Spirit? To help answer these questions I was drawn to a familiar text, the parable of the lost son found in Luke 15:11-32. A father had two sons and one of them chose to leave the security of home and venture out into the world, a dark sinful world filled with sin. Most of us know how the story ends, with the son coming back home.

But what helped to bring this about? I believe it is in part, the act of repentance. Notice three vital characteristics of what I would like to call Spirit driven repentance. First, there is what I would like to call Spiritual Realization. In v17 we read, "When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have food to spare, and here I am starving to death!'" For repentance to be real he had to be honest about his situation and what he had done. Second, there is Spiritual Resolution. We read in vv18-19, "I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired men.' So he got up and went to his father." This young man, through his selfish decisions, had impacted many people, but the most important was his father. (I think of Psalm 51:4 & 2nd Corinthians 7:9-10.) No finger pointing other than the one pointing back at himself. He was so convicted of this reality that when he greeted his father he said, "I am no longer worthy to be called your son." He had true sorrow. Third, there is Spiritual Reformation. Up to this point, the work of repentance has been the young man's. He had some serious choices to make and the best one he made was to turn around and go back. I think of how this young man must of looked upon his return for he was in the "fields to feed pigs." The father clothed him with a robe, a ring and sandals for his feet. The father also fed him at a banquet, providing all he could possibly need. The son's decision to turn around set the stage for God to do some amazing renovating.

So, what does this have to do with us as Christians? As we grow in our understanding of God's will, there are times when we come to understand that what we are doing conflicts with His will. True change, I believe, is the result of this same process called repentance. We realize that we need to change as well as be real that without change it causes our Lord pain. Turning to Him we can know that He will renovate our hearts (Romans 12:1-2) so we can be more like Him. When was the last time you repented as a Christian?
