"KINDNESS"

Kindness is something in which every person can improve and grow; judging from the new testament's words on the subject, God plainly intends it to be a common characteristic of His saints. Kindness does NOT "come naturally" for everyone, and it is especially hard to extend kindness to some folks. When a man knowingly lives a wicked life, Christians can be sorely challenged to show him much kindness; but such is our responsibility, Colossians 3:12. In Ephesians 4:32, Paul instructs us to "... be ye kind one to another...."

purity, knowledge, patience, and genuine love, 2 Corinthians 6:6. tenderheartedness, and a forgiving spirit, Ephesians 4:32. compassion, humility, and meekness. Colossians 3:12.

These are all qualities which God displays in His dealings with us; to be more like Him, we should begin by copying HIS KINDNESS. This means being the servants of one another, and considering each other above ourselves (as in Philippians 2:3).
