KEEPING OUR COMMITMENTS

People think nothing of saying they will do something, then failing to follow through. Sometimes these failures are trivial, but what about the times when they are serious? Someone takes a job, agreeing to do a certain amount and quality of work for a specified amount of pay, then can't be counted upon to show up and do the work. Another person borrows money from another, agreeing to repay the loan within a certain time, then reneges on the payments. A man or woman vows to assume the responsibilities of marriage — “*for better or worse, forsaking all others, until death do us part*” — then vacates the moment things turn from better to worse, or can't be trusted to faithfully forsake all others, or is long gone long before death is on the horizon.

Worst of all is when we — you didn't really think I was only talking about other people, did you? — deal with God in this manner. We make a commitment to serve Him when we become disciples of Christ, but conveniently forget the obligations of that commitment whenever it suits us. We can't make time to assemble with the saints as we should (Hebrews 10:24-25; Acts 2:42). We can't be bothered to share the gospel with others (Matthew 28:19; Acts 8:4). It's too much of a burden for us to be dead to sin and live for righteousness, or make ourselves a living sacrifice (Romans 6:1-14; 12:1-2). Moreover, we get angry when someone calls to our attention the fact that we're not living up to our duty to the Lord in any of these areas.

We expect God to keep His promises to us. Suppose God decided to neglect this commitment: “*For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more*” (Hebrews 8:12). Suppose He said, “*Yes, I know I agreed to forgive your sins and forget them, but I changed my mind. I'm going to hold those sins against you anyway.*” Where would we be then? If we count on God to do what He has said He'll do, should He not be able to depend on us? I fear sometimes we allow ourselves to believe God owes us something — we rely on His providence and mercy because we think we deserve what we receive from Him. But Jesus tells us that the master owes the servant nothing, even if the servant is obedient in every way: “*Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do'*” (Luke 17:10).

God does not owe us His thanks or reward for a job well done. Rather, we owe Him our most diligent, faithful service. In the same way, whatever commitments we make in life, we should honor them: *it's what is our duty to do.*

JESUS OFTEN DID THE UNUSUAL (Luke 8:2)

The above text is among the curious gospel statements about Jesus. Jesus and the 12 toured Jewish cities and villages teaching about the kingdom of heaven. A group of women accompanied who helped support these men by contributing from private funds. On this tour the women were among those who had been healed of demonic possession and sicknesses. Mary Magdalene also was mentioned as being among the group of women from Galilee who followed Jesus at the time of his crucifixion (see Matthew 27:55, 56; Luke 23:49). Why did Jesus allow these women to associate with him in public? In Jewish society then, a woman was not to be in public with a man. This socially unacceptable practice was forbidden and contained enormous danger for misunderstanding. Why would Jesus permit that? Most of what we know about Biblical references to evil spirits is speculation. Evidently, unclean spirits, demonic spirits, and evil spirits refer to the same phenomena. Were you a person possessed of an evil spirit in Jesus' ministry, and Jesus cast that spirit out of you, how grateful would you be? Were you a Jewish woman who was so blessed, and were you restricted in ways to express your gratitude, what would you do? A way to express gratitude in keeping with the good received was to minister to Jesus and his work. Would you be grateful? Oh, yes! Would you wish to show your gratitude? Oh, yes! Would you wish to express gratitude in keeping with the good you received? Oh, yes! Lessons: (1) Jesus permitted gratitude. (2) Gratitude was expressed in service. (3) No one had been too bad to help!
