The teens have prepared fruit baskets for the widows and widowers. If you would, stop by the table and the teens will help you find your basket.


Tonight the youth group is planning on going to the Land of Lights in Athens. We will leave right after this evening's worship service.

ARE YOU A "GOOD PERSON"?

Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is for their salvation. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not in accordance with knowledge. For not knowing about God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. Romans 10:1-4

Are you a good person? What a hard question! As compared to whom? The popular comparison is to someone we regard to be extremely wicked, selfish, and greedy. In that comparison, we usually say, "I like to think I am a good person," or, "I never do these things ..." or, "I always try to do these things ..." When "good" humans are compared to "bad" humans, we look pretty good.

What if the comparison is to God? That is the comparison we never like! Why? No matter what acts or attitudes are compared, none of us look good. We are talking about the One who gave us Jesus, who gave us forgiveness, who gave us mercy, and who provides us salvation in our unworthiness. How do you compare yourself to that?

Understand one thing, an impossible despair is replaced with the hope of expectation. What one thing? This realization: God does not compare! He gives us Jesus for two objectives: (a) to eliminate comparisons and (b) to provide us goals for transformation. God looks at you, your personal potential for godliness, and your commitment to growth in Christ-likeness. How much do you believe in what God did for you in Jesus' death and resurrection? Is your confidence in your deeds or in God's achievements in Jesus Christ? Do you obey God to place God in debt to you, or do you obey God to express your gratitude? Do you serve God because you fear divine punishment, or because you genuinely desire to be like Jesus? Do you do good to honor yourself or to honor the Lord? God knows your background, weaknesses, struggles, and failures, and it is okay—if you place your confidence in Jesus. Some of the most religious people Paul knew made a huge mistake: they placed their confidence in their deeds instead of what God did in Jesus Christ.

SILENT SPEECH

Influence has been a vital part of our most fundamental lessons. Our first effort at writing words involved a written example of the A-B-C's. Math problems—from the most fundamental arithmetic to the most complex calculus—was made clear to us by the use of examples; it is the same with biology, chemistry, football, or computer science. We can just do it better after we've seen it done.

Could I suggest some sermons you could preach without ever having to enter the pulpit?

Say something to others by how you speak. If you speak with a clean tongue in this world of filthy language, you are saying something about how you feel about taking God's name in vain, about using terminology, about speaking derogatorily all the time. What do you think people "see" when they "hear" you?

Say something to others by what you wear. Sloppy dress says something without saying a word. Provocative dress—low neck lines, short-short skirts, tight clothing—is a speech that should not be in your vocabulary. Conversely, proper attire, modest apparel, appropriate dress all make a strong statement without a word.

Say something to others by how you act. Everyone wants to have fun, it is part of the good life. But when fun goes ballistic, when restraint goes out the window, when loudness and silliness takes over, you are saying, and loudly enough for all to hear, that you don't give much consideration to control, much concern for orderliness. It's fine to have fun, but you don't have to amplify it to a ridiculous extreme. Conduct speaks volumes.

Say something to others by your choice of associates. Stay long enough in an atmosphere and you become like those with whom you share it. If you choose to associate with people who have no concern for God, who are constantly deriding those who do, then it won't be long until you join their chorus. On the other hand, if you associate with godly people, people who have Christ in their hearts and love on their minds, you will likely adopt their views and endorse their good example.

Say something to others by your attendance at worship services. If you are the only one on your block who gets up on Sunday and makes his way to the services of the saints, you are making a loud, discernable statement to your neighbors. You are telling them what you consider to be important, what takes precedence in your life, and by that you are recommending the same high life to them. But if you only attend sporadically they hear your voice clearly; it says that you are satisfied with spiritual mediocrity and will attend when it's not too much trouble or when there's nothing more exciting to do. What are you saying on Sunday morning?

Now, I've not used a host of scriptures to prove these assertions. Why? Because, I needed only one. "Let your light so shine before men that others may see our good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5: 16)

Need I say more?
