Frequently this "interpretation" bit is only an effort to give respectability to a purely private opinion. "Interpretation" — when properly used with reference to God's Word, means, "to tell the meaning of."The "meaning" must originate with the Bible, not in the person's imagination. In any event, no one has the right to speak of their interpretation of the Bible until they have made a careful study of the text, in its context, coordinated all like passages, and reached a conclusion as free of bias and prejudice as is humanly possible. The Proof is in the Doing

In Matthew 21:28-32 Jesus tells a parable about a man who had two sons. He came to the first one and said. "Son. go. work today in my vineyard." The son told his father he would not go, but afterwards he regretted saying that and went to work. The father went to the second son and also told him to go work in the vineyard. This son said, "I go, sir," but he did not go. Jesus then asked His audience, "Which of the two did the will of his father?" This seems like such a simple guestion that it doesn't even need to be asked, but with this question Jesus is teaching an important lesson that we often fail to apply to our own lives. Jesus is reminding us that the proof of our love, faith, and reverence for God is in the doing, not the saying. How many times is this lesson taught throughout the pages of the New Testament? - "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thorn bushes or figs from thistles?" (Mt 7:15,16). - "Not everyone" who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21). - "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves" (James 1:22). - "What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him?" (James 2:14). -"My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth" (1 John 3:18). Every one of these verses is well known to us, but do they express a principle by which we live?
