## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

During December, many people who are otherwise irreligious or unconcerned about spiritual things will turn their thoughts to a Child born in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago. They will often read the story of the birth of Christ with their children, and maybe even teach them the words of some of the beautiful songs that speak of the birth of our Lord. They will pause in front of a nativity scene somewhere and maybe even whisper a fleeting prayer. Some will darken the door of a church building for the first time since last December. I view such events as these with mixed emotions. While God has never commanded people today to observe a special day to commemorate the birth of His Son, I am glad these folks have at least some recognition of a God in heaven who demands their attention. However, I am saddened by the fact that most of these people will never come to know and appreciate the rest of the story! While the entrance of God's Son into the world was incredible, it is only the tip of the iceberg -- it is only one part, one chapter, of what God has done to redeem mankind.

## HAVE YOU READ YOUR POLICY?

People often accuse insurance companies of not honoring their policies. Having spent a few years in that business I know the charge is seldom true. State and federal regulations force insurance companies to honor their policies. Insurers do exactly what they say in their policies; the problem is that most people have never read their copy. What keeps people from reading their policy? Sometimes people trust their agent so they figure there is no reason to question his word. This is sad, for there are a few "bad apples" in every business. Sometimes people claim the policies are too difficult to understand. I believe most people who say this have never attempted to read their policy anyway. I have also noticed that many people look at religion the same way they would a life insurance policy. They put blind trust in a smooth talking salesman (some preacher) and hope that he knows what he is doing. They never read their policy (the Bible) for they imagine that they couldn't understand it anyway. It is much easier to trust a priest or preacher than to read and study for themselves.

The Holy Spirit guided the apostles in the writing of the New Testament (John 16:13). Paul told the Ephesians that "when you read, you may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ" (Eph. 3:4). The Bible was written so a person with a limited education can read it without difficulty. The Bible can be understood. It is given to us in this life and will be opened before us at the judgement (Rev. 20:12). **TEMPER, TEMPER!**

A short fuse is dangerous both in dynamite and in people. Though some think it’s “macho” and smart to “blow off steam” with little or no provocation, God’s word teaches otherwise. Fortunately for all of us, God is slow to anger. *“The Lord is merciful and gracious, Slow to anger, and abounding in mercy”* (Psa. 103:8). Were this not the case, surely each one of us would be destroyed! Whereas men may think having a quick temper is smart, the wise King Solomon says, *“He who is quick-tempered acts foolishly”* (Prov. 14:7). Again he says, *“Do not hasten in your spirit to be angry, For anger rests in the bosom of fools”* (Eccl. 7:9). And once more, *“He that is slow to wrath has great understanding, But he who is impulsive [lit. ‘short of spirit’] exalts folly”* (Prov. 14:29). Someone has written, “The emptier the pot, the more quickly it boils.” Let the quick-tempered take notice! Nor is a short temper a sign of strength. To the contrary, it demonstrates that one lacks the strength to control his passions. *“He who is slow to anger is better than he who takes a city”* (Prov. 16:32). Remember, when steel loses its temper, it becomes weaker; the same is true of people. A short temper is incompatible with God’s will in our lives. *“Therefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath; for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God”* (James 1:19, 20). Blowing your stack only adds to air pollution!
