The Friday after Thanksgiving is referred to as "Black Friday" by many in the financial industry. This is the day when American shoppers rise early, flock to the stores and unleash a month of buying that is without precedent any other time of the year. It is called "Black Friday" because the financial bottom line for many retailers turns from red (loss) to black (profit). The Christmas Season has become a consumer spectacular that is seemingly crucial to our nation's economy. Is that why Santa Claus, in many instances, is more revered than Jesus Christ?

What's in a Name?

During the American War for Independence, there was a military leader who accomplished great victories for the Continental Army. He joined with Ethan Allen's Green Mountain Boys for the capture of Fort Ticonderoga, acquiring critical armaments for the American forces. This Major General of the Continental Army also played critical command roles in the Battles of Valcour Island, Ridgefield Connecticut, Quebec City, and Saratoga. He was injured in battle at Saratoga and then given command of the garrison at Philadelphia. He ended his American military career while in command of the American fort at West Point. In the Old Cadet Chapel at the current U.S. Military Academy at West Point there are memorial plaques bearing the names of the generals who commanded the fort during the War. The one for this commander has no name, only a rank and birth date. There is another monument at Saratoga National Battlefield Park near the point where this general was wounded in combat. It is a stone boot bearing no name, only an inscription on the back anonymously describes who it memorializes. Why? Because the name of this general is Benedict Arnold. His name is not, however, remembered for these achievements, but for high treason. During that final command at West Point, Arnold's path down the road to betrayal culminated when he attempted to hand the fort over to the British. This path was littered with injuries to Arnold's pride, social status and military career by political adversaries. Instead of honoring the oath of loyalty he took, he succumbed to pride, ambition, and a selfish desire for recognition. Instead of being remembered as a key military leader in the war for our freedom, the name Benedict Arnold is habitually assigned to individuals who betray loyalty to others. The Lord God expects our name and reputation to be according to the example of Jesus Christ.

Several that we have mentioned of late are: GEORGE MITCHELL, OLA PEARL REEVES, GARY BRILEY, who are all improving.



The Forgiven, Forgive

The forgiven forgive. At least that is God's plan. Joseph decided to follow God's plan of forgiveness. His brothers had mocked him, sold him, and lied about him. During the following years he served as a slave, prisoner, and finally an official in Egypt. During a terrible famine, his brothers in desperation, came to buy grain from Egypt. Although they didn't recognize him, he recognized them. He didn't seek vengeance, instead he made provisions for them and his father, Jacob, to move to Egypt. He and Pharaoh provided abundantly for them. But eventually Jacob died. The brothers became very nervous believing Joseph's kindness was only for his father. Would he strike back at them now that their father was dead? Notice Joseph's answers.

Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid, for am I in the place of God? But as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive. Now therefore, do not be afraid; I will provide for you and your little ones. And he comforted them and spoke kindly to them Gen. 50:19-21.

Joseph Knew...Vengeance is God's Place. There are some shoes that are simply too big for us.

Vengeance is God's, He will repay (Romans 12:9). When we fail to forgive, we create an environment to seek vengeance. God Works all Things

Together for Good. Joseph knew his brothers plans were wicked, but God can always trump man's plans. Joseph knew God used their wicked plan (and Joseph's faithful service) to save many lives. Can you say, "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose (Romans 8:28)?"
