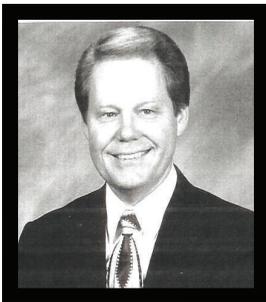
A member of a certain church, who previously had been attending services regularly, stopped going. After a few weeks, the preacher decided to visit him.

Others who have been ill are better.


