“TODAY’S CHURCH”

Today we have the new gospel of health and wealth which seems to be saying that God is primarily concerned about His people having sound physical health (and feeling good) and prospering materially (and living in affluence). The gospel of salvation from sin and eternal life hereafter, with its cost here of penitence, commitment, obedience, service, sacrifice and suffering, has gone out the window. Today we have the social gospel that has spawned the “family life” centers that minister to the “whole man” (mentally, physically, socially and spiritually, with the spiritual emphasis coming in dead last). A large church in Dallas, Texas polled its members and others in the community to see what they expected and wanted of that church; then they proceeded to provide it for them. Their numbers increased even more, but growth in numbers does not prove that a work is of God. God never did anything that way, and man is not benefited by any such procedures.

God rather makes it abundantly clear in His word that our thoughts and ways are not His and His are above ours as the heavens are above the earth (Isa. 55:8-9), that the way of man is not in himself and that thus it is not in man to direct his way (Jer. 10:23), and that man has always gotten into trouble as a result of pursuing his own thoughts and ways (Isa. 65:2; Ps. 81:11-12; Prov. 14:12). We must humble ourselves before God, turn from our own ways, and walk willingly in the way of God. We must recognize the sovereignty and wisdom of God and accept His word as our only and all-sufficient guide.

Let us not be like those described in Isaiah 30:8-9: “Now go, write it before them on a tablet, and inscribe it in a book, that it may be for the time to come for ever and ever. For it is a rebellious people, lying children, children that will not hear the law of Jehovah; that say to the seers, See not; and to the prophets, Prophecy not unto us right things, speak unto us smooth things, prophesy deceits, get you out of the way, turn aside out of the path, cause the Holy One of Israel to cease from before us.
