ARE YOU ONE PERSON ON SUNDAY, AND A WHOLE DIFFERENT PERSON ON MONDAY AND TUESDAY?

Hypocrisy means to live a lie; to be a human contradiction; a walking deceit. Basically, it is the perfect character trait of the devil himself. Ask yourself: how do I act on Sunday? Am I always smiling, always shaking hands, paying attention. Now compare that "you" to the "you" during the week. Is there a difference?

Consider some verses on the subject:

"Ye that love the Lord, hate evil" (Psa. 97:10).

Can I love the Lord on Sunday and not love Him on Monday? Yes, by not hating evil on Monday.

In Proverbs 6, we learn there are seven things God hates. One of which is "a false witness that speaketh

lies" (Pro. 6:19). Ask yourself: Is my life between services a walking lie? Or maybe:

Is my life *during* services the lie? Either way, God hates hypocrisy. A hypocritical life has nothing in common with God. It is, however, a perfect fit for Satan.
